**T-Mobile Faces Regulatory Scrutiny After Hack**

A Federal Communications Commission probe into the hack of T-Mobile US Inc. is the agency's first high-profile cyber inquiry under a Biden administration that has promised to more aggressively police companies' security standards and privacy safeguards. The hack, which T-Mobile disclosed on Monday, hit a communications sector in which cyber oversight is spread across federal agencies, including the FCC, which has taken a largely hands-off approach to data security in recent years.

### **Pa. senator's plan to issue election subpoenas 'stopped'**

A backer of former President Donald Trump's effort to [carry out an Arizona-style partisan review](#) of Pennsylvania's 2020 presidential election suggested Thursday that fellow Republicans in the State Senate are blocking his efforts. In a video posted on Facebook, [State Sen. Doug Mastriano](#) (R., Franklin) did not name names, but blamed "the powers that be" for preventing him from holding a meeting of the committee he chairs to vote on issuing subpoenas to counties for election equipment and materials.

If Sen. John Sabatina Jr. (D-Philadelphia) wins a judicial seat in November, he would resign from the Senate in January, which would prompt a special election. Sabatina won the 5th District seat in a 2015 special election and secured a second full term last year with no Republican challenger. Democrats outnumber Republicans in the district, 61% to 25.5%, with 13.5% registered as independents or with smaller parties. The city's Democratic and Republican Parties would select special-election candidates.
