PA Cong. Mike Doyle says he's tested positive for COVID-19

U.S. Rep. Mike Doyle – Chairman of the House Energy and Commerce Committee's Subcommittee on Communications and Technology – has tested positive for COVID-19, he said Wednesday on Twitter. "Despite being fully vaccinated and taking the appropriate precautions, I have tested positive for COVID-19 while in Washington for votes," wrote Mr. Doyle, D-Forest Hills. The congressman said he is feeling "okay" and having mild symptoms. He added that he'll be quarantining in Washington, D.C., for 10 days, as D.C. requires. Pittsburgh Mayor Bill Peduto told Mr. Doyle on Twitter, "Sending prayers from Pittsburgh. Rest and listen to your doctors. We need your leadership and appreciate all that you do."

World's Largest Chip Maker to Raise Prices, Threatening Costlier Electronics

The world's largest contract chip maker is raising prices by as much as 20%, according to people familiar with the matter, a move that could result in consumers paying more for electronics. Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Co. plans to increase the prices of its most advanced chips by roughly 10%, while less advanced chips used by customers like auto makers will cost about 20% more, these people said. The higher prices will generally take effect late this year or next year, the people said.

Facebook Said to Consider Forming an Election Commission

Facebook has approached academics and policy experts about forming a commission to advise it on global election-related matters, said five people with knowledge of the discussions, a move that would allow the social network to shift some of its political decision-making to an advisory body. The proposed commission could decide on matters such as the [**viability of political ads**](#) and what to do about election-related misinformation, said the people, who spoke on the condition of anonymity because the discussions were confidential. Facebook is expected to announce the commission this fall in preparation for the 2022 midterm elections, they said, though the effort is preliminary and could still fall apart.
