White House to Name Rosenworcel as F.C.C.'s First Female Leader

President Biden is expected to nominate Jessica Rosenworcel, the acting chairwoman of the Federal Communications Commission, to the permanent job this week, putting her on track to become the first woman to lead the agency, a person familiar with the process said. If she is confirmed by the Senate, Ms. Rosenworcel would lead an agency whose responsibilities include ensuring that millions of Americans have internet access. The F.C.C. promotes competition among providers, scrutinizes mergers between telecommunications and broadcast companies, and regulates communications by radio, television, wire, satellite and cable.

The right's effort to police Facebook worked

One of the earliest studies Facebook conducted to measure its influence centered on American electoral politics. On the day of the 2010 midterm election, the social media site encouraged users to vote. It was a controlled experiment, and the results were convincing. About 340,000 people voted in the election who otherwise might not have after seeing a message indicating that their friends had. Researchers have known for years that social pressure can increase turnout, as demonstrated in offline experiments. But here was evidence that a site used by millions of Americans might be able to get a large percentage of them to vote.
